I senatori romani (1870-1922)

The essay gives an account of the presence and activities in Palazzo Madama of 45 members of the Upper Chamber, all born in Rome, during the 52 years in question (1870-1922). Somewhat less than half of these men (21) were appointed in accordance with category XXI of the Statutes, i.e. thanks to their wealth. Only a few enjoyed positions of political importance: these were the Ministers Tommaso Tittoni, Alfredo Baccelli, Camillo Corsi and Domenico Grandi, and Francesco Nobili Vitelleschi, one of the members of the *Giunta d'inchiesta agraria* (Board of Enquiry into the Conditions of the Agricultural Class).
